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### Term 2 COVID Update

#### What's new in Term 2?

From Week 1 of Term 2, students and staff who are identified as close contacts will be able to attend school with the following risk mitigations in place:

- You must notify the school if you/your child have been identified as a close contact and are intending to return to school.
- You/your child should conduct a daily rapid antigen test (RAT) and receive a negative result each morning before attending school for 5 subsequent school days as part of your personal responsibility to minimise the risk of transmission.
- Staff members must wear a mask, primary school students are recommended to wear a mask.

#### Masks

The latest NSW Health advice recommends wearing a mask for people who have recovered from COVID-19 and recently completed their 7-day isolation period for an additional 3 days (from days 8 to 10 after receiving a positive COVID-19 result).

### Winter is coming and our students are hungry

We have noticed that as the weather cools down our students are becoming hungrier. We ask that families support their child to pack more filling foods in their lunchbox for the colder months. The staff are happy to warm food up for the children while the weather is colder if they would like to bring noodles or left-over meals.

Mrs Harrison has also suggested that students bring a pair of slippers to leave at school. In winter, students' shoes get muddy and wet so this would allow them to leave them outside and wear their slippers inside.
